
Many people get backache, but how can you prevent it, and, what can you do to make it better? Here are a few ideas to help you.



Sitting for hours in front of a computer is not good. You should always use a chair that has a back. You should sit straight and you should stand and stretch every twenty to thirty minutes.



Another important factor is your bed, as many people spend eight hours or more in bed every night. Your bed should be firm as your back needs to be straight. You shouldn't have too many pillows because your neck should not be too high.



It's also important to think about how you stand. Stand straight and pull your shoulders back. You should also wear shoes with low heels, because high heels are bad for you.
